## **CPMR: OUR VISION**

- A balanced regional development across Europe
  - □ CPMR Cohesion Core Group (Cohesion policy, RFF, European Semester, Next Generation EU...)
- Increased territorial accessibility for all regions and sustainable mobility
  - □ CPMR Transport Working Group (TEN-T, sustainable mobility, maritime transport, ports)
- A green transition leaving no regions behind and based on territorial strengths
  - ☐ CPMR Climate Task Force (Offshore wind, bioenergy, circular economy...)
- A strong maritime dimension in EU policies
  - □ CPMR Maritime Working Group (Sustainable Blue economy, Common Fishery Policy, coastal Tourism...)
- → CPMR promotes EU policies based on multi-level cooperation and a place-based approach

## **CPMR: HOW WE WORK**

- Influence EU policies and negociations
  - Recognised as strong and influential regional organisation in Brussels, driven by regional politicians
  - A General Secretariat staffed with 40+ analysts and experts well connected to EU institutions (European Parliament, European Commission, Council).
  - A strong impact on policy via analysis and position papers
- Foster cooperation and increased capacity among Member Regions
  - Strong knowledge building through an extensive network
  - A network to meet, learn, exchange & cooperate with reliable partners
  - High-level working groups providing valuable information to members regions on key issues at stake for EU policies

#### **EVALUATION**


The CPMR launches several studies and conducts questionnaires with its Member regions to evaluate key aspects of EU policies of regional relevance

#### ANTICIPATION

The CPMR adopts detailed proposals ahead of the European Commission proposal on the future of the EU Budget and core EU policies

#### **DIFFUSION**

Much of 2019 is spent influencing the European Parliament and Council as negotiations on key EU policies were taking place



The CPMR organises several initiatives to prepare for the post-2020 period, from reflection seminars to the elaboration of principles for the future of EU policies

The CPMR provides a detailed analysis to lay the ground for a political reaction on EU legislation of regional relevance

#### CONSOLIDATION

The CPMR devotes a significant amount of energy to consolidate its proposals until the final hours of the negotiations over the post-2020 period, whilst taking action on new proposals to address the COVID-19 pandemic

## Thanks to the Conference of Peripheral Maritime Regions:

- Major cuts to the cohesion policy budget were avoided under the 2021-2027 EU Budget
  - Peripheries are better covered by the nine Core Network Corridors under the **Connecting Europe Facility** (CEF) 2021-2027
- Cohesion policy covers **all regions** in the European Union
  - A greater flexibility in the use of the **European Maritime and Fisheries Fund** emergency measures for the aquaculture and fisheries sector was achieved
- The 2021 **EU Strategy on Offshore Renewable Energy** mentions specifically peripheral and maritime regions and acknowledges its needs and specificities

- The partnership and multilevel governance principles have been safeguarded in the cohesion policy package 2021-2027, reinforcing the role of regions regarding cohesion policy management and delivery
- Regional authorities can apply for direct access to funding under the **Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund** (AMIF) of the European Commission
  - A share of the EU recovery plan will be delivered via **Cohesion policy**
  - The Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) 2021-2027 includes an additional objective and award criteria on **territorial accessibility and connectivity**, and a higher share of the transport envelope is allocated to the Comprehensive Network
    - Maritime cross-border cooperation programmes are a reality in the 2021 2027 period

## 2021 | EVALUATION

The CPMR has already launched several initiatives to evaluate the implementation of EU core policy areas within its membership

## 2022 | REFLECTION

The CPMR will build on evidence and input from its on the post-2027 period. The 'Territories Matter' initial reflection on the future of EU investment policies




