






Erasmus+ Budget

More than EUR 3.1 billion for School Education

More than EUR 5.5 billion for Vocational Education and Training

EUR 1.5 billion for Adult Education



Policy priorities – supporting the EEA

- Inclusive Erasmus+ : enhanced opportunities to people with fewer opportunities, easier access for smaller organisations
- Green Erasmus+: financial incentives for using sustainable modes of transport. Invest in projects promoting awareness of environmental issues
- Digital Erasmus+: support the development of digital skills, exchanges via eTwinning, blended mobility





Partnerships for cooperation – what to expect?

Cooperation Partnership

- Involving at least 3 organisations from Programme Countries
- Transnational project supporting Erasmus+ policy priorities
- Fostering innovative practices and/or exchanges of best practices
- Duration : between 12 and 36 months

Small-scale partnerships

- A new action for newcomers and grass-root organisations
- Involving at least 2 organisations
- Duration : between 6 and 24 months

Erasmus+ Teacher Academies

- > Partnerships of **teacher education and training providers**
- To develop joint modules/ courses e.g. on inclusive schools or language learning – online and onsite
- Involving at least 3 organisations :2 providers of initial teacher education, 1 provider of continuing professional development for teachers
- ➢ 5-7 projects selected annually
- > Duration : **3 years**



Partnerships for Excellence

Erasmus+ **Centres of Vocational** Excellence

#EUVocationalExcellence

- Provide with high quality skills and competences for quality employment and career-long opportunities
- Contribute to innovative, inclusive and sustainable economy
- Operate in a local context, closely embedded in the local innovation ecosystems
- International collaborative platforms, various organisations involved
- Approximately 10 projects per year with the duration of 4 years
